

In 2022, Goodwill Industries of Kanawha Valley, Inc. embarked on a year filled with accomplishments that reflect our commitment to serving West Virginians and continuing the legacy of our organization. The year began on a snowy morning with the grand opening of our new retail store in South Parkersburg, a nostalgic moment that harkened back to our history of growth and expansion. This new store, attached to our 2nd Prosperity Center location, allowed us to extend our services, reaching thousands of West Virginians in need. It was a year of milestones and community engagement as we opened two additional stores in Sophia and South Parkersburg and celebrated the grand reopening of our Madison store, collectively adding 40 new jobs to each location and contributing to the economic growth of these communities.

As part of our commitment to accessibility and convenience for our generous donors, we expanded our presence by adding more donation bins to our service area and launching our Mobile Donation Station. This innovative station made it easier for people to donate and offered fundraising opportunities for nonprofits and schools throughout our 20-county area. It was a nod to our rich history of serving communities and fostering connections.

Our custodial services continued to thrive as we secured successful janitorial and maintenance contracts, including partnerships with West Virginia State University and the Charleston Dirty Birds. These contracts created dozens of jobs for some of the most vulnerable individuals we serve, aligning with our long-standing tradition of providing employment opportunities to those facing barriers.

In 2022, we remained steadfast in our mission to assist individuals in entering or returning to the workforce. Our Missions Team had a remarkable year, breaking records by serving over 2,200 people and successfully placing over 150 individuals in employment. We also expanded our Staffing Services Division and introduced new programs to support our veterans' community, showcasing our commitment to inclusivity and opportunity.

One of the most significant highlights of the year was the launch of our "Wheels to Work" program. Acknowledging the transportation barriers faced by many in rural West Virginia, this initiative aimed to bridge the gap by providing reliable transportation solutions. Throughout 2022, each store opening not only represented growth but also symbolized the creation of 40 new job opportunities within the respective communities. 
Thomacini Brown

She faced the harsh reality of unemployment, compounded by the need to use a cane due to her injury. It was during this challenging period that Thomacini discovered the Goodwill Prosperity Center in Charleston, West Virginia.



At the Prosperity Center, Thomacini connected with the dedicated staff of Goodwill's Mission Services, who provided her with the support and guidance she needed to regain her footing in the workforce. Fortunately, when Thomacini arrived at Goodwill, a janitorial position had become available in the administration building.

Today, at the age of 67, Thomacini Brown proudly serves as a Janitor in Goodwill's Administration Building. Her mornings are brightened by conversations with President & CEO Dan Owen, and she has found a sense of belonging and camaraderie that makes her workplace feel like a second family.
